Scripture: Jeremiah 9:23-24: "This is what the Lord says: 'Let not the wise person boast of their wisdom, or the strong person boast of their strength, or the rich person boast of their riches, but let the one who boasts boast about this: that they have the understanding to know me, that I am the Lord, who exercises kindness, justice and righteousness on earth, for in these I delight,' declares the Lord."

True boasting is acknowledging God's grace, His provision, His power at work in our lives. Our abilities are gifts, and our achievements are opportunities to glorify Him.

Challenge: When you're tempted to boast, redirect your focus. Give thanks to God for His blessings. Share stories of His faithfulness. Let your life be a testament to His goodness.
